LOCATION

For YC09 we will return to the venue of our 2008 camp: Narrows Park near Hamilton. The site is situated in a great country location just a few minutes south of Hamilton on Highway 21.

The grounds consist of two large fields flanked by the Waikato River on one side and a large gully on the other; all excellent places for a range of activities.

A large hall with adjacent kitchen provides ample space for indoor activities as well as for meetings and meals. Accommodation is in bunkrooms.

ACTIVITIES
