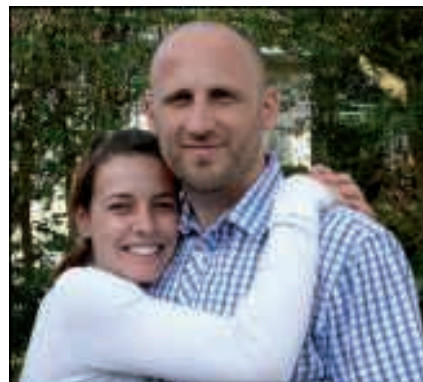


# TEACHING

## INTRO

These annual Youth Camps are for young people aged 13-18, particularly – though not exclusively – from those churches in New Zealand that are Baptist and Reformed. The leadership team is made up of camp directors Fred Schaumkel, Aaron Falconer (both of Shore Baptist Church) and Dafydd Hughes (Grace Reformed Baptist Church).

## AIMS

- YC FUN:** To provide an enjoyable, interesting and stimulating holiday for young people.
- YC FRIENDSHIP:** To provide an opportunity for good friendships to be formed among youth from like-minded churches.
- YC FOCUS:** To present the Gospel and encourage young Christians in their walk with Jesus.

## LOCATION

For YC11 we will return to a unique location: Camp Bentzon on Kawau Island in the Hauraki Gulf. The site has proven very popular on four previous camps.

The grounds consist of an open area bounded by the camp buildings, native bush and North Cove. A hall provides ample space for indoor activities as well as for meetings and meals, while sleeping accommodation is in bunkrooms.

Transport to the Island is by ferry from Sandspit Wharf and a bus will be chartered to take campers from Auckland (Smales Farm bus terminal on the North Shore) to the ferry. If you need help getting to Auckland please contact us as there may be others traveling from your area with whom we can put you in touch.

## ACTIVITIES

The camps provide a full programme of activities such as canoeing, sailing and swimming, abseiling and a confidence course, as well as more leisurely indoor and outdoor games. There will also be ample time at camp just to sit around, chat, play board-games and enjoy other informal activities such as fishing from the wharf.

Activities are overseen by appropriately experienced or qualified leaders.
