### **— GRACE REFORMED BAPTIST CHURCH, PALMERSTON NORTH —**

The Lord has sustained the ministry over the summer, and mostly our numbers held up even though most of the church members were away at some point. Ian and Kath were able to share of the work (and the wider FRBCNZ scene) formally and informally among a number of churches during their visit to the UK in December. Over recent months the church has been encouraged by wider contacts with new groups in Rotorua and Wellington who are eager for fellowship. The pastors of both these churches preached here in January and their ministry was a blessing. We give thanks that the Lord sends such encouragements.

Dafydd and Maria are about to embark on their overseas tour to India and Britain. In their place we welcome a number of our FRBCNZ brothers who will be ministering God's word to us over the next seven weeks. Upon the Hughes' return we plan an evangelistic outreach to the community around the School where we meet, distributing evangelistic invitations to our Easter services which will be held on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> April.

### **— MARCHWIEL REFORMED BAPTIST CHURCH, TIMARU —**

On 14<sup>th</sup> January John Leever preached his last sermon as pastor of Marchwiel RBC. We do give our Father our grateful and hearty thanks for John's eight years of ministry here. We know his work for the Lord is not finished and we pray that many opportunities for preaching the Word will open up. John will continue to support Grant in his ministry as Elder.

But as one chapter closes another begins for on that same day Grant and Petru Phillips and family arrived in Timaru. Grant preached his first sermon on 21<sup>st</sup> January. We look forward to the

Grant is still looking for a part time job and this is a matter for prayer.

As most will know, we are planning to have a commissioning service for Grant over the weekend of the 31<sup>st</sup> March when the RB Fellowship will meet here. We praise God for His great goodness to us as a congregation.

———— **TAMAKI REFORMED BAPTIST CHURCH, AUCKLAND** ————

At Tamaki we continue to know much of God's blessing. This year we replaced our Christmas tract with a half-page advertisement (ie tract!) in the local paper. With its main theme that Jesus is Lord, it was delivered into 43,000 homes on the Friday before Christmas. (This also protects us from the new "junk mail" by-laws in Auckland!) We have had some feed-back and one visitor as a result. Please pray that God would continue to use what people have read.

Our congregation continues to grow both in numbers and in grace, and includes a number of unconverted people who attend regularly. We are part way through a series on Isaiah – interrupted for a month on the Christmas story – now running in parallel with studies in John 1.

Our services in the Retirement Home resume 4 February, although we have had continual contact with people in the home. We have been greatly encouraged by the growing faith of numbers of these people, even as they face illness and death. Please pray that we will continue to have the physical and spiritual resources to sustain this ministry.

The evangelistic opportunities remain large in our district. We continue to pray for God to supply workers who can go out into the homes and shops to "fish"!

———— **TRINITY REFORMED BAPTIST CHURCH, HAMILTON** ————

We held our second Christmas Pageant in December. The ladies of the Coffee, Craft and Conversation group decorated the Hall with their craft work emphasising the theme "The True Meaning of Christmas." One of the local papers published a report and photo and numbers attending were very good. All who came were given refreshments and a tract. After Christmas our pastor served as chaplain to the Raglan Beach Mission. Studies on the gospel from the Book of Romans at the beginning of each day set the scene for a day of evangelism and community service. We provided free kayak rides, sunscreen and cool water. Children were offered face painting and craft activities within the shade of our marquee. Magic shows with a gospel theme attracted beach goers. Thousands of tracts were given out (many courtesy of Trevor Keam who joined us for a day's evangelism) and hundreds were spoken to about their spiritual condition. We used techniques pioneered by Ray Comfort which begin by focusing peoples attention on the fact that they have broken God's Laws, and then move on to proclaim Jesus as the Saviour.

On the 22 December a long time adherent of the church, Mrs. Elma Ringer, died of cancer. She and her husband Jack had served as missionaries for many decades in northern Pakistan. Her funeral was delayed so that her oldest son Steve and his wife Meryl could come from England. The church was overflowing as friends and family gathered to give thanks to God for the life of this godly woman.

During January the pastor has presented a series of messages from the Book of Ruth. Two Fellowship Teas in January have seen a presentation of slides of Ada Lou's recent trip to China and a presentation by one of the missionaries we support, Jeff Lane, concerning his work among overseas students with O.M.F.
