Plans are going ahead to apply for a building consent for extension of our hall. We plan to have a one day retreat on 6 to 7 Feb. 2009. We have recently been registered as a charitable entity under the Charities Act 2005.

We are very thankful to the Lord for His encouragement and blessing over recent months. In October we witnessed the baptism of four young people. We thank the Lord for Simon, Rebecca, Jono, and Ellie, and pray that they will be built up in their love for Christ and make a valuable contribution to the life of the church. In late October we also enjoyed our combined church camp with Marchwiel Reformed Baptist Church. A good number of people attended and we were very challenged and encouraged on the vital theme of 'Walking with God' by our speaker, Troy Cane from Australia.

We have also held a series of outreach meetings in Rolleston over the last few months under the theme 'Introducing Christianity'. These were well supported by the church and we have seen a number of visitors, including two young families who have come regularly over recent weeks. We are very aware of our need of God's wisdom (James 1:5) as we consider how best to develop this opportunity for His glory and the good of people in this growing community.

We have recently discontinued our weekly advertising in a local paper which provided us with 'free' editorial space. For various reasons we did not think it right to continue this method of outreach at this time. It is also

likely that the Mothers & Toddlers group which Maria and Robyn Good were conducting in our home will also be discontinued. Maria will not be available to help during 2009, but we also found that despite regularly leafleting the area no-one from the community came to the meetings.

Recently we have had two men attending services sporadically. One came through seeing the sign we have outside the school where we meet on Sundays, the other through reading one of the leaflets we distributed in mailboxes in the area. The second man showed some interest in knowing more about Christianity so we began a series of eight evangelistic studies; he came to a number of these but missed some due to ill-health. Also during these past two or three months two of our young people have begun to trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and are asking questions, reading books and showing evidence of a work of grace in their hearts.
