## - Grace Baptist Church, Christchurch ————

The Lord has continued to faithfully care for His people in the church here over recent months (Lament. 3:22,23). In the ministry of the Word in our Sunday services we have largely been considering a series from Acts 9-15, looking at the theme 'How God Builds His Church'. We pray that the Lord will make us faithful co-workers with Him here in Christchurch, and that His great Name will be glorified in every aspect of our life and witness.

We have also commenced a series of classes on Sunday evenings on the subject of baptism. 5 or 6 people in these classes are seriously considering being baptised and added to the church here. In our Wednesday evening Bible studies we have just begun some studies under the title 'The Big Picture', looking at the history of God's saving work as it is progressively unfolded from Genesis through to Revelation. We currently have about 30+ people attending this Bible study, and need wisdom on how best to develop this opportunity.

The recent arrival of a family from South Africa has been a great encouragement to us; not only because this increases the number of core families in the church by 25%, but also because they are committed to the church and keen to become involved.
