We are greatly enouraged with the addition of ten people to the membership of the church on Sunday 13 December. We pray that the Lord will continue to add to the church and help us as we seek to serve Him together where He has placed us.(Philippians 1:27-2:4)

We are thankful to the Lord for giving us open doors to serve Him over this past year, particularly in the weekly opportunities to bring the Gospel to people in Rolleston, with our Sundays@4.30 meetings, and in the regular services at the Albarosa rest home. we pray that the Lord will bear fruit through these opportunities and continue to keep these doors open (Colossians 4:3,4) and open hearts to trust in Him (Acts 16:14).
