On the ministry front, we have started our preaching series this year — Acts. We trust it will be an invigorating season for us. Also, being close to the beaches we plan to make the most of the fading summer by entering a sandcastle building competition. The event is run by a community initiative called neighbourly.co.nz and we want to use the opportunity to raise awareness of our church in the local scene. Also this month, we begin an apologetics series with teenagers/uni students. It is open invitation and we look forward to a whole raft of great discussion and interaction. Lastly, Bruwer has signed on for one paper of study with Grace Theological College, which will run throughout the year.

The word 'replantation' describes the focus of our labours in 2013: we relocated our meetings to the central city, changed our name to Crosspoint Church, and reviewed many aspects of the church's life and ministry: there is now greater clarity, unity and purposefulness in our service for Christ, for which we thank God.

We go forward with a sense of expectation: we have seen a number of visitors in recent weeks, some of whom have returned again and again, appreciating the focus in our services upon the Word of God and the faithfulness with which it is proclaimed. Most are from church backgrounds that are very different from ours and we want to interact with them with patience, wisdom and grace, praying that the Spirit will speak to their minds and hearts through the preaching of the Word. We also long to see the needy touched by the gospel, and as hopeless as it sometimes seems when beggars

come in off the street asking for food, we pray that the Bread of Life and the Water of Life might satisfy their most urgent yet unfelt need for reconciliation with God.

In addition to our two Sunday services, we have a mid-week meeting for Bible Study and prayer, and on the fourth Sunday each month we have a Rest Home service. Currently, we have neither children's nor youth meetings due to our limited numbers, but Dafydd produces a children's programme for a local Christian radio station which also continues to broadcast his sermons each Wednesday.
