Of course there is sadness that a rich fellowship in Christ may be ending, yet we are confident in God's grace and sovereignty, and are also truly thankful for all that God has done in us and through us over the years. The elders, members and congregation are praying about and discussing this, and will be meeting to seek God's direction for the best way forward. Once a decision has been made we will notify you all. We are grateful for the assistance prayers and generous support we have received from so many of our sister churches.

-COVENANT GRACE BAPTIST CHURCH, TIMARU

Covenant Grace is experiencing a time of great blessing from the Lord through faithful preaching of the Word, wonderful times of fellowship, and increasing growth; we welcomed three new people into membership last month. We are still going through Romans in the morning service (it's been almost 6 years so far!), and in the afternoons we are going through 2 Samuel.
