after the evening service once a month which has increased our weekly evening attendance. We have recently welcomed seven new members with one baptism and have many new families and young adults now attending regularly causing us to be almost at full capacity for the building. Due to increased numbers we have recently appointed two new deacons giving us a total of five deacons and two elders.

#### -West Church, Auckland -

We have been encouraged throughout the year at West Church. There has been a consistent presence of non-Christians in our Sunday gatherings, which has been really wonderful as we know that they are hearing the gospel each Sunday! It is also a great reminder for us to take prayer seriously as only God can rescue them. We have been very encouraged in this area as many of these non-Christians have shown great interest in knowing more of Christ.

We have also been very thankful for the five new members the Lord has brought into the church this year. They have all been wonderful blessings to the church. We've also had two fantastic 'fellowship days' this year where we've discussed together big things related to the church, the latest one being held on November the 9th. The unity and open discussion during these meetings are something we continue to be thankful to the Lord for.

We've also had Dwayne Tongamohenoa begin his internship with the church this year in August. Similar to Hanli's internship previously, he is currently being supported to set 1 day per week aside for the church, where he meets with Stephen and Hanli, studies online at Covenant Baptist Theological Seminary, and prepares to preach once a month, amongst other things. We hope to increase this to two days per week in April 2020. Lord willing, in 2021 the membership will come together to discuss and vote on setting him aside for pastoral ministry.

As we draw to the end of the year, we are preparing for a special carols service on Sunday the 22nd of December. Instead of holding the church service inside the New Lynn community hall, we will be set up outside the hall. We will have a small BBQ running and various other foods available for free to encourage people to join us. Hanli and Dwayne will also speak briefly. We are praying that God will lead many non-Christians to join us so that they may hear the gospel!
