It was a joyful and refreshing time to return to fellowship with God's people with the whole congregation included. During the Level 3 and Level 2 restrictions, Covenant Grace met as two separate congregations to ensure the gathering limits were not exceeded, so we are very glad to put this and Zoom Bible Studies behind us. The lockdown has helped to teach us the immense importance of the gathered church, and the blessing that God promises when we meet together. We have also realised it might be a wise idea to get an internet connection for our church building! The biggest news we have to share is the near completion of our new church building, which is due to be completed in July. The lockdown drastically slowed progress on the build, but now the end is in sight.
