# COVENANT GRACE BAPTIST CHURCH, TIMARU

We had our annual Family Camp at Raincliff early in February. The Lord blessed us with lovely weather. Our camp speaker was Jason Winslade who spoke on 'Foundations of the Faith.' On the Lord's Day we held our Morning Service at camp and had a lot of visitors come out for the day.

Sunday School and Bible Class recommenced immediately after camp. We look to the Lord for His help in these ministries. This year Nick is preaching through 1 Corinthians in the morning service and in the afternoon service he is teaching from the 1689 Confession.

We continue to see visitors at our services on a regular basis. There are a lot of children and young people in our church too, with more babies expected during the year. It is our earnest prayer that those young folk who are Christians will grow in grace and that the Lord would be pleased to draw those who are unconverted to Himself.

The Roving Classroom will be held in Christchurch on 2nd May, and we are grateful to Rob Harrod and Grace Baptist Church for helping with some of the arrangements. In regular ministry Dafydd is preaching through the Sermon on the Mount in the mornings (part of a larger series in Matthew's gospel), while in the evenings he has begun a series in the Song of Solomon.
