A Report on the Meeting to discuss the establishment of a Fellowship of Reformed Baptist Churches in New Zealand

The meeting was held on the 27th of July at Emmanuel Church in Auckland. It was attended by leaders of Marchwiel Reformed Baptist Church, Wellington Reformed Baptist Fellowship, North Shore Reformed Baptist Church, Tamaki Reformed Baptist Fellowship, Manukau City Bible Church, Emmanuel Church, Grace Baptist Church and Trinity Reformed Baptist Church (David Marshall from Trinity chaired the meeting).

It was decided that a newsletter would be circulated among the fellowship following the closure of the Grace and Truth Magazine. To further encourage fellowship, Stephen Turner is organising a pastors and wives overnight fellowship gathering for the 10th to 11th of October.

In considering what more we could do together, the importance of consultation in planned activities was encouraged to maximise the participation of all churches and fellowships. The benefits and blessings of conferences featuring overseas speakers were gratefully acknowledged and there was an expression of anticipation that these would continue to the widespread encouragement of all.

A discussion was held as to the basis for a co-operation between New Zealand Reformed Baptist Churches and Fellowships. The question of a basis of fellowship was widely discussed and it was decided that David Marshall would research the available range of Reformed Baptist Association constitutions for circulation and consideration among those involved.

The desire was expressed that the Fellowship develop as a forum for discussion and guidance while respecting the autonomy of the local churches, and avoiding an authoritarian structure.

The next meeting will be held on Saturday the 12th of October.
