We have just returned from our Church Camp where we were joined by the Marchwiel Reformed Baptist Church, Timaru, and a family from the Hokitika Church of Christ. It was a wonderful time of relaxed fellowship and stimulating teaching by way of video messages by Dr. R C Sproul. This was our first such camp... the first of many, we hope!

There have been a number of encouragements recently, with baptisms, additions to our membership, and new people in regular attendance. Dafydd and Maria were away in India for most of October, and during their absence the church enjoyed the ministry of three members of the church as well as a visit from Stephen Turner. Since then we have returned to our ongoing series from the book of Philippians, which is proving to be both encouraging and challenging. A new 'Discipleship Group' meeting has started on Tuesday evenings in which eight people have committed themselves to meeting with Dafydd & Maria for a fairly intensive programme of reading, Scripture memorisation, discussion and prayer: they are currently working through the excellent book, "The Enemy Within: straight talk about the power and defeat of sin" by Kris Lundgaard.

Trinity has just completed a seven week series of morning services on the theme Reformation Overview. Each week featured a different Reformation leader. During the first part of the service we had a sermon on a relevant topic. We then took a coffee break and reassembled in the hall to watch a biographical video. The topics were: John Wycliffe – Scripture Alone, John Hus – A Believing Church, Ulrich Zwingli – A Memorial Meal, Martin Luther – Faith Alone, John Calvin – God's Electing Love, Michael Sattler – Freedom of Conscience and William Tyndale – The Priesthood of All Believers. People were particularly moved by the martyrdom of the Czech Reformer John Hus. The series was based on material produced by Christian History Institute in the United States.

Our Coffee, Craft and Conversation outreach every Tuesday morning continues to grow, with up to twenty in attendance including a number of non-Christians. Recent crafts have included scrapbooking and cardmaking. Every session features a devotional talk, mostly given by Jill Marshall and Lois Gore. A highlight of last term was a combined meeting with another group which attracted forty participants.

The Bible Study group meeting on the campus of the University of Waikato has gradually grown with some overseas students attending.

The church's Bible Study groups have variously tackled the Book of Job, the Book of Genesis and the Book of Romans. Many of the groups use Bible Studies produced by Matthias Media in Sydney.
